The Albion Quartet brings together four of the UK's exceptional young string players: Tamsin Waley-Cohen and Emma Parker (violin), Ann Beilby (viola), and Nathaniel Boyd (cello).

Since forming in 2016, the Albion Quartet has enjoyed numerous competition successes including awards from the Borletti-Buitoni Trust and ECHO Rising Stars. Recent debuts have included the Concertgebouw Amsterdam, the Auditorium du Louvre in Paris, and London's Wigmore Hall. The Quartet's thirst for exploring the repertoire of the chamber string quartet genre expresses itself through innovative and eclectic programming.

The programme is based largely around the theme of friendships. It is well-known that Mozart and Haydn admired each other's work (Mozart dedicated a number of works to Haydn), and that Haydn was one of Beethoven's most influential teachers. Beethoven's work was in turn greatly admired by Schubert even though it is unknown whether the two ever met. Brahms was an early champion of Dvořák's early work, and was instrumental in the younger composer's success. All of the above are represented. On Sunday morning, we also hear a short contemporary work by Freya Waley-Cohen – sister of violinist Tamsin.

A central highlight will be a performance of Schubert's String Quintet, performed on Saturday evening, for which the Quartet will be joined by cellist Hannah Roberts.

The Castle Hotel
